With this revised new name we are modifying our main QQI Level 5 PLC courses slightly with some new versatile modules being introduced to each course.

For example Business is being rebranded as ♦ Office Administration with new modules such as: Reception and Frontline Office Skills, Database Methods and Digital Presentations being introduced. 

UCC Plus Tutoring Hours: Because of our links with UCC, 6th year students had additional tutoring hours in Higher level Business, Irish, DCG, Music and Construction Studies throughout the year. This additional tutoring was invaluable especially in preparation for the Irish oral exams. 6th Year students also attended revision days in UCC for Biology and had virtual revision classes from MTU for Maths. UCC/CIT Science camps: Again, due to our UCC and MTU links, six of our 1st year students will attend a two-day Science camp in MTU Cork for two days in June. Day one of this camp will take place at MTU Cork and day two in UCC. Being exposed to these third level campuses so early in second level will hopefully motivate and inspire them to go on and pursue third level courses in such colleges. UCC Easter School: Six of our TY students attended UCC for two days in April. This provided our TY students with an introduction to university life in the hope of inspiring them to consider UCC as a third level destination. This opportunity allows students to become familiar with the range of degree programmes on offer, the campus and the broad range of services and supports available.

C.A.O Updates: The 1st of February was the deadline for applying through the C.A.O for college courses in Institutes of Technologies and various Universities. Students applying through the C.A.O can however get a chance to make changes to their application if they so wish up until July 1st online free of charge. No date has yet been confirmed for offer of colleges places, but we have been informed it will be later than other years. This will also delay the beginning of the college year next Autumn which may pose difficulties for those seeking accommodation. Applications for PLC Colleges: Macroom FET Centre (McEgan College), St. Johns College, Colaiste Stiofain Naofa and The College of Commerce are still accepting applications for courses. Congratulations to our 6th Year students who have already received offers of courses in some of these colleges.


